(3) SYLLABUS

The course is divided in two parts. The first focuses on the political and economic history of the post-war period. Beginning with the Interwar and the socio-economic and psychological consequences of the Second World War, we move to the Cold War, the different political systems of Western and Eastern Europe, the European Economic Community, the process of decolonization and the emergence of the Third World. We consider the period of crisis (1973-1993), the fall of communist regimes and the revival of nationalism, with special reference to the war in Yugoslavia.

The second part of the course turns to the social and cultural history of the post-war period. We examine social transformations (urbanization, immigration, the rise of literacy, the increase of the student population, the women's place in work and politics, as well as broader social and cultural issues (gender relations, sexuality, the family, youth culture, consumerism, and social movements, such as feminism and the student, ecology, gay and disability movements). Finally, the course explores post-war science and technology, and the history of post-war Greece.
